- 1. Respondent can continue to provide counseling services, but must do so under the following terms and conditions:
- 2. Respondent will be abide by the Social Work Board consent order dated October 10, 2008.
- 3. Respondent's status will be listed as "probationary" on the NCBLPC website for the period of the Social Work Board consent order, which is to be two years from October 10, 2008.

- 4. In addition to the terms of the Social Work Board consent order, Respondent will complete 6 hours of continuing education in billing practices within the next 12 months, and submit proof of completion to the Board. This 6 hours is in addition to the hours needed for renewal.
- 5. Respondent will keep the NCBLPC updated on any modifications or notices of violations of the Social Work Board consent order.
